Dear Mr Perkins:

Please accept my request to change my campaign reporting from mini to full reporting.

May 19, 2008 I submitted a Candidate Registration Form C1 marking the box Option 1, Mini reporting. Because I was running unopposed, I planned a campaign that would require a small amount of funding.

The afternoon of June 6th I learned I had an opponent. That news changed my entire approach, as I realized I would have to change to the full reporting option. I was concerned with making and filing the proper notice(s) with the Public Disclosure Commission (PDC). I immediately contacted the PDC, and our local County Auditor to make sure I was proceeding correctly. After these contacts, I believed my filing of an amended C-1 met my PDC notice requirement for changing to full reporting.

This letter is submitted in the spirit of a formal written request to approve my change request. There were no attempt(s), or intention(s) to mislead the public by my actions. Attached are the following documents:

- 1.) An amended C-1 registration indicating a switch to full reporting.
- 2.) Copy of letter to my opponent advising him of the change.
- 3.) Copy of e-mail confirmation to PDC of how and when my opponent was notified.
- 4.) A C-4 report with Schedule A disclosing all contributions and expenditures through July 1, 2008.

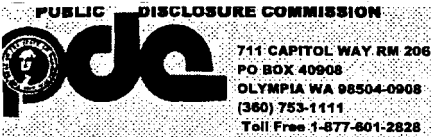

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Dear Mr. Perkins,

I am sending you this e-mail pursuant to our telephone conversation on this date, when I first learned of the additional requirements for changing to full reporting. Needless to say, I was distressed to discover this.

I first filed my C1 in May, indicating that I would be using mini-reporting, as I did not expect to have a challenger. On the afternoon of June 6, much to my surprise, I learned that Mr. Thompson had also filed for the same position.

I proceeded to review your "starting off on the right foot" publication, and inquired of our local county auditor and the PDC as to how to change reporting methods, I was advised to file an amended C-1, which I did on June 10. A few days later, after several phone calls to PDC, I spoke to someone there regarding when C3 and C4 forms were needed. I was advised to file a C3 on the Monday following any week that the campaign received over \$200. I was also told to file my first C4 on July 29, and then one 7 days before the election and on the 10th of the following month.

I certainly had, and have, every intention of following the rules and requirements of the PDC – and until today, felt that was happening. I have on this date mailed to Mr. Thompson a letter advising him that I filed an amended C1 on June 10, indicating I would use the full reporting system.

As I told you today, we are not requesting or accepting any contributions – I am financing my campaign. A complete and specific report of money we have deposited and spent follows:
